Kate lives a dual life. Half her time is spent as a typical teenager going to high school, cheerleading practice, and clothes shopping with her friends. The other half of her time is spent training in combat and slaying vampires. The set up is very much ripped straight from Buffy the Vampire Slayer, complete with her crew of fellow vampire hunters like the Scoobies in Buffy, a group of managing paper pushers like the Watchers, being raised by her single mother, and even a mysterious part-vampire romance interest just like Angel. But at 30 percent, the story finally leaves the Buffy structure and journeys out on its own, when one of her teammates is kidnapped and it's up to Kate to rescue her.

Since the set up is so much like it, it's hard not to compare it to Buffy the Vampire Slayer, and comparing it does fall quite short. The characters in Buffy are so much more colorful, from Willow to Xander to Giles (there's even a Cordelia character who isn't quite as catty as the early Cordelia). But once Blood Pact ventures out on it's own, that need to compare the two lifts and the reader can easily enjoy the story for what it is. And it is a fun story that holds the attention, has the thrill and mystery of vampires, makes you worry for the heroes, and smile at the adventure of it all. Though the kids are kids and they do dumb things and you get frustrated wondering why they just run into situations without backup, but then they are teenagers and the story does go in many fascinating directions. I would recommend this for people looking for a short, fun story, where the vampires aren't just thoroughly evil, but straddle the fine grey line, and the like a healthy dose of teenage angst, drama, and shopping in their story. In other words, it's almost like a blend of Buffy, Twilight, and a teen drama. As for further books in the series, since it's past the Buffy set up, the series does have potential to grow on it's own into a fun, adventure series.
