The heroine wants to research 'a first kiss' for a book she's writing. In the process she runs into the 'hero.' She trips, he picks her up. And no, I don't mean he helps her up, or steadies or asks if she's all right. No, he picks her fucking up and places her on a bar stool. Then he proceeds to call her 'Sunshine' like she's five. Then he takes her notebook from her, against her will, reads what's inside, and then pockets it and demands she go out with him in order to get it back. Lest you feel sorry for the heroine of this tale: she agrees to this, thinks that he's hot, and when she meets him outside (with his personality-vacuum of a best friend and her "friend") and he refuses to disclose where he's taking them, she does not at any moment feel concerned for her safety.

It's in *His Kiss*, by Caitie Quinn, was just kind of meh for me. I didn't particularly like Jenna or Ben. Jenna is a YA author who is being forced by her publisher to write her MC's first kiss into the next book. She enlists her friend to help her do "first kiss" research. She struck me as sort of awkward and out of touch where I wish she'd come off as intelligent and/or geeky. She was a tiny bit geeky, but more so quirky, in my opinion. Ben came off as this pushy, smart-assed smug guy. (view spoiler) For me, there was not really any chemistry between them. I hated Jenna's friend Lisbeth. While alphabetically planning out the first bunch of books to read in 2017, I came up empty for an author whose last name begins with the letter Q. But GoodReads came to my rescue! I found that my GR friend [Kathy * Bookworm Nation](#) has some Catie Quinn books highly rated. And so I was very happy to find this short story for free on Amazon!

It's in His Kiss (2011, QPub Books), 0.5 in the *Brew Ha Ha* series by Catie Quinn, is a contemporary romance set in a metropolitan college town. It's a standalone short story (or perhaps a short novella), but the main characters appear in at least one of the later books in the series.

Rating: 4 stars

The heroine: Jenna Drake is a YA (young adult) author, and her publisher is now mandating that since her main character Chloe is growing up in the series, "it's time for Chloe's first kiss." Jenna consults with her friend Lisbeth for advice, because "It's been a long time since my first kiss. I'm not sure I could imagine it. I mean, can you even remember your first kiss?"

The hero: Ben initially meets Jenna due to the fact that he's laughing at her. (This is generally not an advisable way to meet people!)

Christian elements: This isn't a Christian fiction selection. It is basically clean, but it's plain that the characters (and/or their world) don't have the same lifestyle that I value. An example: prior to this story, Jenna's ex-fiance jilted her and then tried to convince her that they "should still have sex on the side." (Given the context, I couldn't tell for certain whether it was implied that they had been engaging in such previously.)

Other quotes I didn't enjoy:

"Hot little body only a bimbo should possess"

"What the hell are those?"

"not-quite-B cups"

"You could get me drunk off one drink"

"___ stood up, patted me on the bottom and said..."

"Sometimes I hated her."

Clean? Umm... Yes. If you discount the quotes (and a few others like it) above. Honestly, it was a clean novel, but very much set in today's world with wordly characters. If that makes sense. This isn't my preferred setting, but somehow the author manages it so that I enjoyed the story thoroughly.

What I liked:

*I liked the humor the author blended into the story. I like books that bring a smile to my face. I chuckled to myself when Jenna wields her "handy-dandy notebook." (Blues Clues, anyone?) Another fun one: "All you had to do was roll a ball and knock down sticks. I could knock down stuff without trying... Klutziness was finally going to be my friend."

*The hero and heroine's meet cute was fun to read. :-)

What I didn't like:

*Just as a warning: It ends a bit abruptly. Part of that is that the short story ended at 89% on my Kindle. I should expect this to happen every once in awhile (especially in a prequel), but I still find it jarring. I never read previews (which makes up the last 11% of this Kindle book), so I just find them frustrating.

*The quotes in the Christian elements section above

*Jenna's very persistent mistaken assumption that Ben wasn't interested in her. Given the situation, it was understandable, but I still found it a little annoying.

The bottom line: This was a humorous and romantic story. I recommend this book to fans of clean, but very contemporary romance. I would not recommend it to a younger audience. I look forward to trying this author again, and plan to read *The Last Single Girl*.
