I was extremely impressed with this book, partly because of the age of the author, but also because she managed to give our myths neat little twists. The characters are interesting and well-balanced. The action is intense and feels real (as much as any vampire/werewolf story action can feel), yet there is just enough romance and down time to give the reader time to catch his/her breath.

The plot is beautifully structured, without being set to a specific formula; the reader is never sure what is coming next, what twist is ahead. In addition, much of the conflict began long before the protagonists in this story ever met. They must overcome forgotten memories, changable fate, as well as the evil being hunted.

Emma is a strong, independent female character struggling with unimaginable pain. She is caught up in multiple conflicts, but the focus is on the vampire responsible for murdering her family. Faolin is her perfect foil, yet he is also her greatest support.

Miller has managed to show, using some sophisticated and subtle techniques, rather than tell the reader about the characters' personalities. At times, we are unsure for whom we should be rooting, as Emma and Faolin meet and get acquainted. However, as they search for the vampire called "Hunter," the reader knows exactly for whom to route.

Miller has intermixed themes, but friendship, trust, betrayal, revenge, and love are all presented and examined, but are done through an enervating, captivating, well-written story that any vampire or werewolf enthusiast should thoroughly enjoy.

If there is one problem with this book, it's that the ending is too much of a cliffhanger. Clearly this is not a stand-alone book, but part of a longer series (a trilogy perhaps?) Therefore, I felt like it wasn't entirely complete, as though it ended in the middle of the battle, instead of after it had finished. I feel that series should have a "pause?" at the end of each story or battle, but here it just stops. I could not make any recommendations without developing a spoiler, therefore, I have said enough on this point.

Overall, I can give this book a solid 4.5 stars and recommend it to older teens and adult, alike. I look forward to the sequel and to seeing Miller's writings as she matures from great to brilliant. And, I have little doubt that she will become a brilliant writer.
