Incredible read. I was sure, from the start that I would hate it, given that Russell is a successful and rightfully established author. That tends to translate into egoistic writing and embellishments.

However, I was taken aback at how honest the author was with himself and his reality. I especially appreciated how in one chapter he addresses his own privilege and remarks "those who dwell on the 'human condition' are usually the most privileged (I paraphrased).

I feel his story of his relationship with his mother many of us can relate to: devout religious maternal figure with little emotional connection--or a connection that is misinterpreted. His metaphors and artfully uttered prose is some of the most refreshing I've read by a millennial author. So many quotable sayings and insights of how trying to escape one's upbringing results in a meteoric grounding back to one's roots.
