Heidi Gibson is in the mountainous region of Alaska for some rest/juice rejuvenation - as being an artist she needs all the inspiration she can get and she was certainly getting inspiration in the beautiful Alaskan mountain. Being attacked by a wolf was so left field from anything she has ever known, but to have a man tell her she was attacked by a werewolf was simply the last straw. If he was not going to help her – she had to get medical help herself and not hear anymore lunacy.

Heidi finds herself using that business card sooner than she thought she would after a series of things are out of sync in her life – then she meets beautiful, brawny Luke and it feels like coming home. ANIMAL INSTINCT the second book in Paige Tyler's Men Of Alaska series and without a doubt a better

I am really liking this series so far, and I hope that Tyler does some more! Nothing too complicated, not a lot of drama or angst, just a sexy, fairly romantic, and pretty funny werewolf read. You definitely need to suspend your disbelief for this one - they fall in love super fast, and, well, the whole werewolf thing!

This book is definitely not a mystery in anyway. It is completely obvious who the werewolf that bit Heidi is, but since the book never really plays up the mystery it wasn't one of those things that bothered me. If the book had spent the whole time about the mystery of the werewolf's identity than I probably would have been irritated. Instead the story focused mainly on developing the relationship between Heidi and Luke.

I loved Heidi's reaction when Luke told her that she was turning into a werewolf, and her complete denial of it all. I thought it was a very believable reaction - someone tells you that you are turning into a werewolf after getting bitten by a wolf you will naturally think they are crazy and go to the hospital to get the bite treated right? I think her denial of the changes that she goes through for the next couple of days is also realistic. When faced with the unbelievable, you naturally justify what is going on, and that is what Heidi did. I hate when the heroine automatically believes and is okay with werewolves. Or when they deny it for too long even when faced with the undeniable truth. Tyler did a great job walking this line.

This book is worth checking out - you don't necessarily need to read the first book, but the first book is also worth reading!
