Jake "the Snake" is back Chicago and his only goal is to get back into Michelle's life and win her heart. Michelle is the woman he has loved for a long time despite turning away from her four years earlier. Why I Read this Book: I've been hooked on this series since book one.

What I Liked: After the prologue, *Rev It Up* starts up right where *In Rides Trouble* left off. The prologue was the most intense part of the book. It just, POW! The prologue sets up the background story for Jake and Michelle. And their romance is not your traditional love story; it's quite complex.

Jake is not an arrogant macho man who thinks he's invincible. He knows there is danger present and he takes caution. He also realizes that Michelle can handle herself so there's no need for him to act like a overbearing superhero. And when he does need to leave her side, he leaves her well-armed.

Just when you think you know all there is to know about Michelle, there's more. Something big and something I sure as hell didn't see coming.

There's a secondary romance blossoming in *Rev It Up* and it's between Rock and Vanessa. The chemistry between them is definitely there. And speaking of Rock, what the heck is that guy's other job??

Jake is back in town to win back the woman he loves. He’s known and loved Michelle for years, but four years ago, hurt feelings, anger and miscommunications drove Jake to push Michelle at his best friend. They married and Michelle was pregnant when her husband, and Jake’s best friend, died in combat with Jake at his side. Jake, still fighting the demons in his head, lashed out at everyone, including Michelle when she begged him to come home. He stayed away, but now he feels like he’s healed enough to come back and try to rekindle the love they had so long ago.

Michelle is a single mom raising three year old Franklin and has just recently been introduced to her brother, Frank’s, team at Black Knights, Inc. The only problem with that is there are prices on the BKI team members heads and that extends to their families, which puts Michelle and Franklin at risk. Frank’s solution is simple, move in with him at his work compound, or let Jake stay with Michelle at her place. Michelle is still so angry and hurt by how Jake treated her years ago, he called her horrible names, gave her no hope that he’d ever want to be a part of her life, all because he was fighting within himself. Michelle has a soft heart though and she slowly falls for Jake, if she ever really stopped loving him at all. They try to work out their relationship while trying to find out who is out to get the BKI team members and their families.

I liked the story well enough, but I found myself bothered by a few things. All of the books in the series are overloaded with slang and pop culture references. The references are toned down in this one, but the slang is still there. Each character has a phrase or two that they seem to overuse, in this case Jake is a California surfer guy, and I cringed a little every time he said or thought “yo”. I don’t know if it was his (for the most part) laid back attitude or the laid back surfer language, but I had a hard time warming up to him as a hero. He loves Michelle, there’s no doubting that and he’s fierce, but there was something missing that made me not fully connect with him and by extension the romance.

Michelle, for all the horrible things Jake said to her years ago, is incredibly forgiving. However, she keeps one whopper of a secret from him that alters their future completely. It’s explained how the events in their past went down and Michelle made as much of an effort as she could to get Jake to come home so she could talk to him, but the truth is, she still kept this from him and for a character that I otherwise enjoyed, this was a big no-no. I did like how she “got” the men. Having lived around the life her brother leads, she’s very sensitive to what these men go through and will sit and listen to any of them talk, if and when they need to. She’s very nurturing and once she starts to open back up to Jake, she makes it easy for him to talk and get everything out.

This story has a different feel to it than the previous two books. The main series storyline is still building, but

it's not centered around the Black Knights, Inc headquarters, which was very front and center up to this point. I overall liked the story, but there was just something missing with the romance for me. Part of it might be the connection I never really got with Jake, and it felt like they went from out of love to in love as a couple pretty quickly. This isn't my favorite of the three books out so far, but I still enjoy the set up for these men and there are a few guys I'm anxious to get stories for. This was a good read, but ultimately Jake just wasn't for me.

I have really enjoyed the previous stories in Julie Ann Walker's Black Knights Inc series but I have to say that Rev it Up was my favourite book so far and it has left me eagerly waiting for the next instalment. We met Shell in the previous book when she was introduced as Frank's sister, she is a single mum to her young son Franklin but we didn't really know much more about her background as Frank had worked hard to keep her out of his life at Black Knights Inc. When Shell introduced her to the rest of the group while Frank was in hospital she picked the wrong time to let people know about her connection to him. With a face from the past looking to get revenge on the team they have all had a price put on their heads and are now facing the constant threat of assassins trying to take them out. The Knights aren't too worried - their compound is secure and they all know how to look after themselves - but when they realise that the assassins have their families, and Shell in particular, in their sights things escalate into all out war.

Shell had her heart broken by Jake four years ago when he pushed her into the arms of one of his friends. She married Preacher but was left to raise her son alone when her husband was killed in action. Jake has always loved Shell but he had his reasons to push her away all those years ago and he has stayed away ever since because he blames himself for Preacher's death. He has never stopped loving her though and now that he has finally dealt with his inner demons he has come back to prove how much he cares and to convince her to give him a second chance. Shell is understandably wary of Jake, she never really got over him and refuses to let him break her heart all over again. She also has a very big secret that she is terrified he will uncover.

Jake may have acted like a complete ass when he walked away from Shell all those years ago but at least he has the balls to admit it and try to put things right between them. I have to admit I fell hard for Jake, he was so sweet and open with his feelings towards Shell that I just couldn't resist him. I loved that he was so understanding and patient with her as she kept pushing him away and that he was determined to break through her tough outer shell and show her how good things could be between them.
