It is a little odd that the sonnets are grouped by broad topic (although many seem to fit into multiple) rather than in numerical order. But whatever.

My main issue with the book is the "fun facts" on each page. While definitely interesting, the sources are cause for skepticism. Some are clearly quality - the Folger Library, for example. Others, not so much. If you are going to include "historical facts," you should probably do a touch more research than [thoughtcatalog.com](http://thoughtcatalog.com) (yes, they actually cite this...). Do some quality research, make your facts actual facts, and this will be a five-star novelty collection.
