The second volume of **Bleach 3-in-1 Omnibus Edition** reveals more of this universe. Meet **Uryu Ishida**, a Quincy archer that has the same goal as what Soul Reapers do except destroying Hollows with a single arrow. As the story expands, so are secondary characters and the powers that all along within **Orihime** and **Chad** that plays an important role in this series. Of course, more comic relief from **Kon** and a new character called **Don Kanonji**, a TV spiritualist that has similar powers as **Ichigo** and the mysterious **Kisuke Urahara**, a man with a hat and clogs that seems to know more **Ichigo** and the rest of the Soul Society. Plus - the appearance of two Soul Reapers that will become important later in the series at the end of this volume and the first major appearance of a giant Hollow name **Menos Grande**.

The consistency is still there, the revealing of characters is good plus others is giving what **Bleach** its own recognition. The artwork has a slight improvement from since the first volume and more details are flesh out

here. Although the supporting characters (especially the female characters) are weak in existence, what keeps this book is the momentum of pacing that did a good job in story-telling.

Vol. 4: Quincy Archer Hates You - A lot of little stories going on here with plenty of humour and action. Vol. 5: Right Arm of the Giant - Whoa! Getting intense. So Quincy Archer's real name is Uryu Ishida and he's definitely a he, there's no mistaking it now. The first half of the book concerns a battle between him and Ichigo which I loved and even though Ishida is a bad guy, I like him. Then it turns out that there are more people than we knew who can see ghosts, Hollows or Soul Reapers and they find out they have special powers too. Chad is featured in the second half and I really enjoyed him being in the spotlight with a little look into his past as he's been a favourite character of mine from the beginning. The title of this volume refers to him. We leave this volume with the battle still in progress and several of our main characters injured to an unknown degree. I haven't mentioned this yet but I'm loving the art. With such a huge cast the artist is able to make everyone very distinct and I'm not having any problems sorting out who is who, though I only have a few names down as of yet. I'll also mention at this point that this manga is very age appropriate. There is one very busty girl but no other sexual allusions at all. Much tamer than say... Dragonball. (5/5)

Vol. 6: The Death Trilogy Overture - Almost the entire book concentrates on the battle started in the last volume and the consequences of it resulting in Ichigo and the Quincy battling together a humongous Hollow. So this is a great volume for battles. Usually the battles are not my favourite parts of shounen but I'm really enjoying these scenes in Bleach! Once things settle down the volume ends on a curious note with the introduction of two new Soul Reapers and their intentions are not good concerning either Rukia or Ichigo.
