This book was a super quick and easy read and would probably appeal to a lot of middle grade readers which is the intended audience. This is also the first book published on 2018 that I've read. That's kind of a big deal to me because I'm really bad at reading new books.

I enjoyed the book for the most part. It was a fun, lively story with a cute animal protagonist. Crimson was realistic and her struggle, while not necessarily something most people can relate to at surface level, was understandable. Most people have likely been thrust into being responsible for something without necessarily agreeing to it. I like that Crimson does not wallow in self-pity, she's a motivated character.

The story felt rushed in a lot of places. It felt like things just suddenly happened and it took me out of the immersion. I feel like this wouldn't be a big deal if I was a middle grade reader. Then again, I seem to be reading a lot of books where the events just seem to happen suddenly.

Overall this book was pretty good and I'm looking forward to seeing what happens in the next one and hopefully I don't have to wait too long.

One criticism I will make that's not related to the book content but rather the format. I could only find it on Kindle eBook with no Kobo version. I had to use my dinosaur of a tablet to read it on the app. I hope that this book is expanded to more eBook formats soon because not everyone owns a Kindle.
