After the humor and lightness of the first two stories in the anthology, entering this dark, cold, dystopian landscape was quite a shock. At it's best, it was like a fabulous blend of Ilona Andrews and '90s-era Linda Howard--tender, sexy and adventurous. At it's worst, there were some awkward transitions, both in writing and in character development, that made me wonder if perhaps some scenes had been edited out because of space constraints. Overall, though, I enjoyed the characters enough to hope that the authors plan to write more stories in the saga of Shane and Nadia.

An ice age has split the world in two, above the freeze line the cold has dulled the earth's magic making it a safer place for werewolf Shane to live. The last thing he wants is the magic calling to his animal nature. Nadia is a witch who needs to be able to connect to the magic to survive, she was kidnapped and forced above the freeze line so that she was unable to protect herself using her magic. She may have escaped but she needs to find a way home and restore her energy levels or she won't survive. When Shane finds Nadia by the side of the road and discovers what has happened to her he offers to help get her back to the other side of the freeze line. As they approach their destination Nadia becomes stronger but Shane's wild side gets closer to the surface, can they fight the attraction that is growing between them? Do they even want to?

I was already a big fan of Moira Rogers so it was no surprise to me that I loved Freeze Line. With the apocalyptic setting this story is darker than the other novellas in the Winter Wishes anthology but I really enjoyed the world building and would happily read more stories in this world if it becomes a series. Shane and Nadia are both great characters and I love the way their relationship develops as they get to know each other. This was a sweet and sexy romance and one I'd definitely recommend.

Moira Rogers has a knack for putting together characters who both challenge and bring out the best in one another. That's the case in Freeze Line. Shane does his best to avoid his werewolf attributes. He lives far above the freeze line, where the earth is frozen and magic is weak. It can't pull on his beast. He puts on a human front around the others in the nearby village, but for the most part lives a solitary life.

Then he finds Nadia on the side of the road. She's not equipped for the frigid weather. He quickly learns she was kidnapped by humans wanting to torture and test on her because of her ability to use magic. The knowledge alone spurs his instinct to protect her. But the lack of magic in the earth is killing her. He agrees to take the woman south, to save her. The closer they get to the magic, the stronger she gets and the more

wild he becomes.

He may be worried about his beast hurting her. His past tells him he can't be trusted around others when his wolf takes over. Nadia is stronger than he knows, and the two can't help but bond.

Freeze Line is a fun, quick romance read with the best paranormal elements of the three in the Winter Wishes anthology. Moira Rogers is able to focus on the 'otherness' in a complete way, even in the shorter form of novellas.

Those of you who follow my blog and Twitter feed know that I have a huge girl crush on the writing duo known as Moira Rogers. And this winter they have a new novella coming out from Carina Press, part of the Winter Wishes anthology (with greats Vivian Arend and Vivi Andrews) that can be purchased as part of the anthology, or a stand alone novella.

An ice age has hit the earth again, and Shane is living well above the freeze line. Because of his werewolf magic, he fears going to live closer to the border, because the tight control he has over his wolf slips the closer he gets to the warmth. He enjoys his solitary life in a small town, making ends meet any way he can.

Out on his snowmobile one afternoon has him running across Nadia, a witch left to die in the frozen wastelands. Nadia was kidnapped by a group of werewolves and tortured endlessly. But Shane is her only hope, and she puts her trust in him.

As the two journey closer to the border, Shane notices his wolf coming more to the forefront, while Nadia's power grows as well. As the two learn to lean and count on each other, they struggle to find a way to be together although they can't live in each other's worlds.

The Rogers team does an amazing job with their world building and Freeze Line is no exception. I've always loved the different takes on what the world will be like post-apocalyptic, and the ice age is always a fun one!

I really liked Nadia and Shane together, both hesitant to trust and rely on each other, but both drawn to each other like a moth to a flame. And the way they are able to make a conscious decision to be together, and actually make it work, warms my heart.

If you're looking for a short and sweet classic romance with a paranormal twist, you need to pick this one up! My only gripe: I really wish it would have been longer so that some of the questions left opened were answered.

All in all, I give Freeze Line 3.5 out of 5 post-apocalyptic ice ages!

2. I hadn't finished a futuristic romance before reading Freeze Line. I had tried a few and they were all DNFs. This just wasn't my genre.

So what do I do when I'm offered an ARC of a post-apocalyptic paranormal romance by an auto-buy author? I take the book, of course :D And I'm very happy that I did.

We have a sexy werewolf tormented by his past but he's willing to face it to help a stranger. Then we have a heroine who has been a powerful warrior for her entire life but now has to depend on someone else just for basic survival.
