Nick and Lilac is a steamy romance with a unique writing style. The author switches back and forth between Lilac's fantasies and her life in the real world. Some might find this challenging to keep up with but it will make more sense as you read. I found as I continued, her fantasy world starting imitating her life in present day. This story contains strong sexual trauma stories that both Nick and Lilac are struggling to deal with. It just so happens this will be the force that binds the unlikely pair together. Nick is powerful with more money than most would dream of. Everyone on campus jumps to please this playboy. Not only does he play the part, he looks the part. None of his fellow classmates know the emotional baggage he keeps hidden deep inside.

Lilac is a scared little lamb who tries to hide behind baggy clothes as she tries to blend in with her surroundings. Her violet eyes, long lashes and beautiful hair make Nick able to spot the real beauty lurking beneath the facade. Her scars run deep and her dreams run wild. Nick has been the only male to reach her heart. Will he be able to hold onto it? Or will his past trample his future?

Nick is afraid to let go of the only woman he has ever loved. He needs Lilac in his life but is only able to

keep her as a friend until he reunites with his true love, Karla. Unfortunately, a friend with benefits is always complicated. Rules are tossed aside as lines become blurred. Can Lilac really be okay with being second best or will her need to love and be loved take control? Lilac is afraid to realize the only man she has ever loved is incapable of loving her in return.

Both Nick and Lilac go back and forth in their quest to find happiness. Much like any book, there is always a hidden message somewhere in the pages of the story.
