This is an uplifting story for kids and adults. It reminds me of those Little Golden Books I read as a kid where the stories had a lesson or a positive message about life (e.g. The Little Red Hen, etc.). Fox Forest Band is about an evil force that comes into the forest. The animal friends have to come up with a way to fight it and restore their peaceful existence. They band together and form a musical group that is so powerful, it makes the force go away.

It is not a scary story for children. It has just the right amount of conflict appropriate for a young person. It focuses more on all the fun things and effort the forest animals do to solve their problem. It's about teamwork, collaboration, friendship and faith. The rhyming and rhythm is nicely paced.

This story is an example of a simple truth: Don't let anything try to get you down or make you feel bad. If someone/something tries to do that, use your positive energy and creative thinking and actions to overcome it, because those are stronger than negative forces. And the more people (or in this case, animals) who do that, the greater the effect.

The illustrations were fun and friendly, too. I hope we get to see future books with this wonderful little group of characters.

This was a cute little book about standing up for yourself. In the forest (and world) where these animals live, there are also wizards, wizards who like to bully the animals (tsk, bad bad wizard!). The book starts off

pretty cute and fluffy, but soon the fog of fear descends and we can see the animals become afraid, you see them share their fears with neighbours and friends. Even though the book is short (only 24 pages) and is a picture book, you could just feel the fear, you could see that this fog, and this wizard wasn't someone you would mess with.

I loved how the animals decided to band together and do something awesome, I won't say what, though the title and cover do kind of spoil the surprise, but at least you didn't hear it from me. ;) I really liked the solution, and I hope that they will bring lots of happiness around the world, hopefully those bad bully wizards will learn not to mess around, though, knowing how bullies are, I guess they will never learn.

The illustrations are pretty decent, they looked really good at times, a bit less at other times, but I still see that the illustrator/author put a lot of love and time in them.

The only thing that I didn't find matching was the font, it felt a bit out of place and a bit too big.

Today We Did

An evil wizard comes to the forest, spreading a thick fog to frighten and cower the forest animals. At first they all want to run away and hide, but then the smart fox outlines his plan to fight the wizard. The animals work together, and stand bravely to face the bullying wizard and regain their safety.

This is a nice picture book with rhyming text, and cute forest animals. It has a simple and uplifting message about overcoming bullying, and is a good place to start a conversation with kids about this often difficult topic. My kids wanted to know why the wizard was so mean, but they were happy that the animals stood their ground even though they were frightened. I loved the way the animals made their instruments from things they found in the forest, quite ingenious really. Seeing the spider joining in with a tiny little instrument made me happy too.

The Fox Forest Band is beautifully illustrated throughout with water colour images of the forest and its inhabitants. We had fun finding the fuzzy little spider in each scene, though my kids pointed out that it only has six legs in a couple of scenes! The animals are really cute, and the text is still clear and easy to read on each page. I liked the hedgehog, while my daughter liked the fox best.

This is a good book for pre-schoolers and primary school children. I read The Fox Forest Band with my toddlers, and they sat through it, pointing to the animals and enjoying it. My older kids got more out of the actual story, but it was still popular with everyone in our family.
