His brother, Tom is days away from competing in the Olympics in the national lightweight rowing division and when Jack find Libby Harris in is home, cooking for Tom, he isn't going to let anyone distractions by him.

Libby is appalled by Jack's demeanor with her. He doesn't believe a word she tells him about making her famous muesli for Tom. Despite his ill attitude, Libby can't help but be aware of the pull she feels between

them.

Libby doesn't want a fling at all, but her inner struggle with her attraction to Jack isn't believable. If I was Jack, I might see all signs saying that she was attracted to me.
