Joyzal, a bounty hunter coming for the pirate captain, is set on keeping his number one bounty hunter status and this pirate captain is sure to help! When leaving, he spots Jacole, and although he recognizes her as human, her dark skin color requires him to offer his assistance. When she reaches out to him, she unknowingly invited him to mating compatibility. When he accepts her touch, sparks fly, and instant desire is clouding their ability to think clear. She thinks he's a hot alien, whose heroism gets her going, he thinks she's now is mate, so takes
