reading this i realized one of the biggest differences between american and japanese comics. when robin, toro, pinky, bucky, speedy etc were created it was to give kids somebody their own age to identify with, however in interviews kids said they liked them because they could pretend to be the adult hero and boss/bully the sidekicks around.

manga almost always has the kid as hero in adult situations, and the manga creators are only in their twenties - little older than their readers, rarely have i found younger sidekicks.
