I experienced this book in its audio version. It's a creative and engaging resource to inform young children about what they can do to take care of the Earth. The sentences are simple and include activities that many children could relate to. I especially like that the author connects these activities with a reason to do them "I turn off the water while I brush my teeth because I love fish and I want the oceans to stay blue." The potential use for this book is awesome. It clearly can prompt discussions about conservation and ecology even among very young children. It certainly lends itself to all sorts of extension activities (e.g., writing, poster making, movie maker, service projects, etc.) The author is Todd Parr, and he has written several books with important messages that are aimed at young children. I must admit that I didn't like this audio version at all. Todd Parr is the reader of the story, and he reads it in a very monotone voice without any emotion or animation. The contents of the book so lend themselves to an animated reading, that its absence is a big miss. I would also have liked it better if he paused after reading each page, so we could enjoy the illustrations. However, I think the book is great, and therefore I don't want my opinion of the audio version to affect my rating of it. I highly recommend it for young children.
