CB's Half Girlfriend was a big let down, considering he is the Most-Read writer of India. The same can be said about Ravinder's Your Dreams Are Mine Now. Ravinder is arguably the second most (or maybe 3rd most, if Durjoy is 2nd) read writer in India. His first book was honest, and simple. But after that, I have only seen a monotonous writing. His last book 'Like It Happened Yesterday' was a sheer disappointment. His latest release is definitely better than the last one. And, I think, it is better than Half Girlfriend too.
