Okay, so I'm giving this three stars because it FINALLY gave me what I've been asking for in this series:

1.) Kira growing a spine for herself--yeah, she's still codependent on Rei, and she places too much of her happiness on him (when she's groped by a group of guys and Harumi asks if she'll be okay, Kira smiles and responds with "I'll be okay--Rei will make me feel better!"), but whatever, like Rei says, she's finally starting to develop a personality (my words) and starting over living life (his words).

2.) More side character action!!! I adore the side characters in this series--we meet Violet, Rei's trans neighbor in his apartment complex, who is funny, insightful, and adorable at the same time she's perverted. Some of the notions/language is outdated (Violet says "I'm woman through and through, I just **have the body of a man**," and then proceeds to show her dingaling to Kira as a joke, but it's 1990-something, so I'm really not too put out by it considering some trans people still think like this today), but the fact that we have a trans character now is AWESOME.

We also get MORE HARUMI AND TATSUYA!! ??? For once they--sort of--talk about something besides Rei and Kira all. The damn. Time. I've always appreciated the female friendship between Harumi and Kira, but as the books go on it seems a lot more genuine and not plot oriented.

We also get more than three pages' worth of their adorable double dates! And actual discussion of their lives, not just Rei's and Kira's lives (for like, two seconds, but still, there's hope).

Hama the moving guy is still awesome and funny, lol. Tatsuya is the sweetest friend ever.

3.) I don't remember if this is the book where they broke up but I don't think so. In any case, it's refreshing to actually get back to their relationship and the troubles that come from wanting to stay together. I much prefer this more average, every day to day storytelling to the mess of drama that has been previous books. There's no more stupid melodrama arising from Rei's past with Sei/Shiori/Masao and Kira being insecure about it while Rei angst and waxes poetic about how much he wants to die.

The drama with Masao was preferable to the Sei/Shiori thing because it was infinitely more interesting to explore Rei's sociopathic side, but even that got worn and dragged out too long, so I'm glad we're back to this actual, you know, NORMAL stuff. And the scene where Rei starts to see everything differently after he's (view spoiler) is adorable, and it's scenes like these that make me like the story.

Today I'm covering a work, which I actually found in yahoo answers. It was a funny story because I was searching for a manga with lots off kisses, and the best answer had a list of mangas. The top one and the most recommended was this one. Though it was not really what I expected (I mean, there weren't that many kisses), however, I enjoyed it a lot! I loved the story a lot. The idea is not all that unique, however, the way the story develops is great. It somehow reminded me of a manhwa – the One, and I'll cover it sometime soon. But let me get back to this story.

If you're waiting for a peachy, rose-color love story, you'll be immensely disappointed. As there's nothing

simple and easy in this story. It starts perfectly normal for a shoujo romance story – a popular boy is interested in a shy introverted outcast. However, the more the story progresses the deeper the problems are and the more we dwell on human psychology. None of the characters are easy to understand and it doesn't help that everyone has at least one deadly secret in the closet. Throughout the story, we are faced with joy, sadness, hatred, and love. The issue of hatred is one of the major ones, as it is shown in many perspectives. The hatred towards another being and hatreds towards your inner self. It is very interesting to watch how the relationship between Kira and Rei develops. They have a number of obstacles before they actually achieve their dreams and mostly all of them are due to the trauma's from the past, therefore the story gets more and more intriguing and you're sucked into it from chapter one.

The author raises a number of questions, which can never be ignored in our life. There's the issue of the family as a whole and there are many others, however, the main one you have to identify for yourself, as you'll be asking yourself on the way: "What would have I done in the same situation?" but before I finish this review, let me talk a bit about the characters. I enjoyed reading about all of them. Sure some of them annoyed me, but I still enjoyed them in the overall. My favorite is Rei, I just liked the guy a lot. He's both the positive and the negative character. He compensates his bad qualities with lots of good ones. However, his temper is one thing he should be working on. Kira – she's a great character, a bit too crybaby, but at the same time she's strong. I don't think you'll agree, but she is strong. There are many more interesting characters than those two, but those two are main so I had to mention them. There are some characters that will make your skin crawl, I do not want to name them, as you'll have to experience them yourself.

Are you up for a romance between an aspiring painter and pro bike racer? Are you ready to find yourself in the dark world of death and life? Hatred and love? Do you have 4 spare hours?
