When his brother gets married, Justus is intrigued by the bride's sister, Angela. He is attracted to her and it seems as if she is as well. However, there's a problem. Angela is about seven years older than him and is starting work as a lawyer while Justus is entering college.

One dance sealed their fate and though nothing happened that night, they both have never been far from each other's mind. Ten years later, they meet again. Before things can even be explored or conversations can be properly had, days after their brief reunion tragedy strikes.
