This collection of exclusive patterns, included with the book, offers step-by-step instruction for making boys' and girls' clothing with a variety of fabric styles and decorative embellishment—including embroidery, patchwork, and trims. The patterns for pants, tops, skirts, and dresses include variations for long and short hemlines and sleeves, various necklines, and adjustable lengths. The patterns are sized from 18 months to kid's size 12.

But the actual content of the book was really helpful, too. I've been sewing for over 25 years but mostly either totally wing it or follow a pattern; this is a nice middle ground of using a pattern but actually fitting it appropriately, too. My only complaint is that in many of the (beautifully artistic and high quality) photos you can't really see the clothes well enough to get a sense of what you can do with them yourself. Like the Feliz: there are two photos and you can barely see the dress in either. Thankfully there's no shortage of photos online (just google "Feliz dress" images or look it up on flickr!). A few more photos of coats and shirts sewn for boys would have been, nice, too.

The pants fit tighter through the hip and thigh than I was expecting. I did

use a french seam to keep the cotton from fraying all over, but I would definitely use a size up unless your daughter is a string bean. My younger is, and these fit her with a trim fit. But my eldest is normal and they were too tight. In the pictures these are baggy, so I was disappointed I will have to remake them. Anyway, very cute and simple patterns.

I stumbled across this book a few years back at a sustainable living fair. At that point, my sewing machine, purchased during my last pregnancy, hadn't seen a bit of action since the introductory class I'd taken to learn how to thread it, and make it go forward and backward. But the color photography in the book made sewing once more enticing, and the fashions were definitely appealing to my daughters' funky sense of style. I began using the book last year, and while it took me some time to get used to the layout and organization, I'm now in love with it. The patterns that come with the book are practical, but the design elements taught can turn anything whimsical. My favorite part about the book is the authors' encouragement to mix and match fabrics, along with discussion on how to do this successfully. As a result, I've discovered that I can be far more economical with my sewing. I now make use of discarded and thrift store clothes, and I've discovered that I can take them apart and re-assemble the fabrics into something my kids love, at little to no cost. The patterns are simple, they cover every item of clothing a kid could need from pajamas and swim suits to party dresses and jackets, and they are all interchangeable. They are also designed with growing kids in mind. A pair of pants is roomy enough to become a pair of leggings as kids stretch and grow over the years. This is a truly rewarding book for the novice and intermediate sewer.
