This one seemed a little rushed on all levels, however I wasn't getting grossed out over violent actions, or blushing because of steamy bedroom scenes. The insta love in this novelette detracts from what could have been a really great premise. The whole thing felt rushed.

Falling in love too quickly and without enough time spent telling the reader the details of their interactions was not what I was looking for in a romance. ...suddenly Prince Nicolas is declaring his love and that he'll care for Kara and her niece and it feels like it comes out of nowhere.

I mean, he's generous in repairing the dance studio, but he's only physically been there a few times and they've shared some texts (at least from what I could tell). Suddenly she's asking about their relationship and where it's headed and he's saying he wants to take her on a date. One passionate kiss later and some paparazzi pressure and he's declaring his love and devotion. Too much and too fast to be believable.

Which is a shame, because it had real possibilities as a plot. And the characters could have been believable and complex given time and space and more detail- -way more detail. (And that amazing dress on the cover! It's not even in the story!)
