One underlying current in the book was the early mixing of French and Native American blood in the back country and the resulting strengths and weaknesses of the main characters as a result.

The primary focus of the book is one couple who meet in the 1840's and have a very tempestuous relationship for many years. The Cedar is the plantation which has been in the family for generations and has also served as a kind of Inn for travelers because it was so remote for many years.

The book was written about 50 years ago, was very well researched and accurate in its portrayal of this small but significant part of the South. This is the only book ever written by this author who devoted her energies to its accuracy. Beautifully written!
