This is a futuristic reality book that touches on the subject of VIRGIN AUCTIONS. Essentially, the poorest women are raised to be the pure brides to the rich. They are taught to be submissive and expected to cater to needs of these affluent elite. Basically, it's legalized human trafficking.

This book is basically told in the heroine's Veronica POV. She is sold to the hero Kristoff almost 40. She thinks her life will be pain and torture.

"She also hoped he was kind and gentle. There had been horror stories of men so cruel, so demanding in their sexual appetites that the wives were damaged physically and mentally."

The heroine, being a young virgin of 20, has been trained and expecting her whole life to be a rich man plaything. She was not expecting to find any affection and tenderness. The hero's behavior puzzled and delighted her.

First by asking her *"Our servants call me Master Kristoff. You are my wife and will not. I am just Kristoff to you, alright?"*

But she thinks *Even her mother, who had been a virgin at the auctions when she was twenty, called her father Master Eric.*

The hero seems so kind and affectionate but can this honestly be true?

That a bough woman such as Veronica, would she finally get to experience love?

Also, this book is a very short and feels like it's missing something. That's why I urge you to read book three after this one.

I read it before and it really made a difference to my understanding of their behaviour.

It still seemed like hero and the heroine are evenly matched despite their socioeconomic differences. As well as their passionate and their growing love for each other.

They are a perfect pair!

However, I must caution you that this is still mostly erotica. It is a romantic and has some action and drama but at the core it's mostly about the physical.

But much sweeter than some of Jenika Snow's other books but still has the passion and some dirty talking (which I secretly enjoy).

Worth a read and even a reread for me.
