Here's a brief description of the book:

The book is a true story by Armando Cosani, a journalist who writes during the Second World War. The first part of the book is Armando recollecting the time he spent with a very special friend, one who never tells him his name but speaks to him profoundly and helps him through some very difficult periods of his life.

The second and third parts are writings his friend asked him to publish for him. The second part is a profound teaching for humanity, and the third is a first hand account written from the point of view of Judas Iscariot of the time Judas spent with Jesus, eventually leading up to the time of the crucifixion. In this part, Jesus asks Judas to betray him in order to help him fulfil his divine mission.

Interestingly, this book was first published in 1953 and it wasn't until the mid 70's before the Gospel of Judas was discovered, and not until 2006 that it was translated and released to the public, and in this gospel Jesus also asks Judas to betray him to help him with his mission, and the accounts of this book and the ancient, previously undiscovered gospel match.

Definitely a very worthwhile read and I'd recommend it to anyone.
