I like this book. It's a real mixture of styles and there are many layers of interest which grabbed me. A young couple visit France after they've been given a free holiday by a kind grandmother. However, when they arrive, they stumble into a world of mystery, madness and mayhem as they learn the history of an amazing shell from a charismatic french sage (and his lovable cuddly canine friend). They discover the guardianship of the golden shell goes all the way back to Atlantis, passing through the hands of some very well known historical names (I won't spoil it for you but some are very famous and even infamous) along the way.

The historical section and explanation of how the shell gets to where it is today was a couple of chapters, which at times I found hard going. It was well worth it though, as the story really speeds up from there on in as good meets evil and the inevitable chaotic climax ensues. That wasn't it though, as the enigma of the shell has to be solved, before time runs out for the human race.

There's some great descriptive passages in this book, and at times you can almost feel you are there watching and sensing the drama unfold like a fly on the wall.

I really like the spiritual aspects of the book, and found the speech towards the end of the book very moving. I enjoyed the eventual unraveling of sometimes shocking historical facts (and fantasy fiction), the conspiracy theories and the ending which was unexpected. I was sent an ARC of this book for an honest review. I was excited about getting an ARC because the description sounded so interesting...however, I was sadly disappointed. For the purposes of full disclosure, I couldn't finish the book (it's also fair to note that I decided not too long ago to no longer read what I'm not enjoying after 30-40 pages, if you don't have me by then, it probably isn't going to happen).

I couldn't get into the story. Though some of the descriptions of places were pleasant, there was much to be desired. The dialogue didn't sit right with me, felt very scripted. Too many things happened, were discussed, or appeared (many small, some of them mid to larger) that seemed to have no context yet were thrown in, seemingly for detail.

Clearly channeling Dan Brown's famous novels, Soul Whisperer takes the reader on a mythic historical scavenger hunt that has roots in the Gnostic doctrines. While the story was mildly interesting it was clearly a vehicle for the spiritual doctrine espoused by author J.M Harrison, and because of that at times it got a little preachy and the mechanisms used to explain the historical back story (trance, dream, etc.) felt a bit contrived. However, the historical interpretation was interesting, and the overall message of "those who forget the past are doomed to repeat it" was well done. Still, I feel like this could use a little polishing to be a really great story, particularly if the vehicles for the historical scenes could be improved. An interesting read nonetheless, so if you are interested in some of the ideas of Gnostics and Essenes coupled with modern conspiracy theories this is definitely your jam.

British author and philosopher Jonathan Harrison is best described as a Teacher of Being. In his previous book **WE ARE ALL ONE** he gently but firmly and supportingly guided his readers towards a path of self-realization. And in his superbly written next book **NAKED BEING: UNDRESSING YOUR MIND, TRANSFORMING YOUR BODY** he advanced his ability to assist the reader in purging the misconceptions of self, offers an understanding of the non-duality (not separating the individual from the universe but instead realizing that all is one) of each of our existences. And in his third book **YOU are THIS: AWAKENING TO THE LIVING PRESENCE OF YOUR SOUL** Jonathan opened his personal experiences and before delving into the content of the book he offered a very helpful glossary of terms that appears to be a signature in his writing.

I found **The Soul Whisperer** by J.M.Harrison to be well written, imaginative and thought-provoking. The story has elements of Dan Browns ticking time bomb style and scenario (heroes desperately trying to solve the mystery and only so much time before the cataclysm hits etc), interwoven with historical facts and the authors take on spirituality, which is deftly drip-fed throughout the book.

My guess is that like **The Da Vinci Code**, people will either love this book or avoid it like the plague. My take on it is that although it's mostly an imaginative fictional tale, it brings to light many present day problems that so need to be considered and discussed within our society. The 'Soul Whisperer' is all about finding and guarding a golden shell that has the power to preserve goodness in the human race, as long as it's in the right hands. It is very much about the spiritual journey of the shell, Jean-Michel, Alex and Sara too.

When Jean-Michel was younger his parents tragically died, a devastated loss he never got over. Combined with losing the love of his life, when her family moved away, he lost his place in the world and through upset and distressed he felt he had no choice but to leave, joining the legionnaires, where he remained for five years.

On his return he carried on restoring his parents land and discovered the shell. As the years went by strange dark forces started looking for the shell. They knew that Jean-Michel had something to do with its disappearance.

Alex and Sara had losses of their own. Alex's mother died of cancer, and Sara unfortunately had a miscarriage.

The pain of both of their losses began taking it's toll on the couple. Seeing they were struggling Alex's grandmother, Lucette, offered to pay for them to spend a month in France as respite. Her one demand only was that they had to pay an old friend of hers, Jean-Michel a visit.

The story is presented through the three of them as they are used to tell the journey of the shell throughout history, via storytelling and a series of flashbacks.

This is a very Spiritual book with an exceptionally strong spiritual element running throughout. I liked the idea that obstacles could be conquered by working together, which in life, if you pull together lots of things can be achieved.

The sections that I found hard to understand and comprehend was the historical journey part of the book. Unfortunately it had many elements that I just couldn't relate to, and I found I was loosing interest as the story went on. If I had not been reading the book in order to write a review, I'm afraid that I may have given up part way through.

I was a bit baffled as to why there was so much historical detail about the journey of the shell, and dark forces after it, but when it came to the shell Jean-Michel, Alex and Sara didn't really have any great struggled to overcome the forces protecting it.

The book does however have plenty of good points including, how well the characters were written and the vivid scenery. Their true to life descriptions and personalities shined off the pages and their life stories played in my head long after the book had been put down.

If you like books about spirituality then give this book a try. I personally found this a bit to heavy going for my liking.
