This book has inspired a new genre for me: Books You Never Want To End.

The firefighting backdrop for dramas, be it on television, film or in books always appeals me. 'Backdraft' has always been a favourite of mine (although, Kurt Russell may have had something to do with that). This excellently written book had me smitten.

Donny Robertson is a dedicated fireman, and when he is seriously injured and his best friend, Fitz, the captain of his unit, is killed in a fire, his dedication to his job spills over into a pursuit to find the answers into why and/or how the callout ended so tragically. But the route is a perilous one. He becomes a watched man and a hunted one. What is it he's uncovering and why does he have to be silenced?

There's no doubt that writing about something in which you have a lifetime experience...or rather, a working lifetime experience...gives a reader a tremendous insight and understanding into the subject. This author

does it with incredible skill. As a firefighter of twenty-five years' standing, he really does know what he's talking about. He doesn't just profile the bones of the job: what stands out in this novel, is the dedication, fearlessness, bravery, selflessness, and courage of firefighters along with the bond, camaraderie, friendship and spirit that develops in a unit. I wouldn't be surprised if each of the firemen characterised in this book is based on a real person, because that's how the characters come over: as real and personable. I'd be happy to be rescued by any of them.

But, on top of all that, is a very solid, well-paced plot that keeps you on your toes to the very end. There's everything in this book: murder, crime, revenge, humour, wit, heroism, and love. The dialogue is real, the emotions tangible, the characters believable.

I have one gripe, however. This is the author's first (and brilliant) but ONLY (to date) novel. I want more...soon.

If there's one book you need to read this year, it's this one.

Donny Robertson is a fireman, but also a man of honour who never lets down his friends or colleagues. When his friend Fitz dies burned in a fire, Donny does not want to jump to easy conclusions as all the others. He begins to investigate on what looks increasingly arson. But his investigation does not please everyone and Donny becomes the target of criminals, particularly the arsonist called "The Spark". Donny therefore encounters many difficulties that had discouraged many, but him. He is a hero, a real one, not one of those American super-heros. He is a man like you and me, but who doesn't give up easily when difficulties arise. His villain is more a super-villain than the hero is a superhero.

This novel is a thriller that keeps the pages turning quickly with a combination of actions scenes, amusing romance, detailed looks into the world of emergency services and toxic chemicals, and a luxurious yacht, which the author uses in a plot twist to send Donny up the Trent Canal in Georgian Bay to Tobermory for the climax of the novel.

I'd have liked not to stop reading, even to eat or to sleep. ;)

I don't know if John Kenny, the author could write about other topics, but his writing is impeccable and he knows how to make his subject interesting with plot twists, funny characters and situations, and dramatic moments. So I hope he will write again because this debut novel is very promising.
