The major flaw about this book is the frequency of grammatical errors, but I decided to forgive that. I forgive it because if this is not the author's first story it has to be an early one. That is not enough by itself to forgive the grammatical errors. What makes it forgiveable is the obvious reason that it has to be such an early work of the author. After looking at the copyright date and some of the biographical information about the author

it is apparent that she was only sixteen years old when the book was copyrighted. Add that to the otherwise high quality of the writing and it is hard to deny that Stacey Hunt is something of a prodigy. The story is well plotted and suspenseful and on par with a lot of best selling thrillers. Most writers at her age are still turning in barely readable essays in English class for the teacher to mark up in red ink. Given those circumstances the grammatical errors pale and they are only occasional anyway. I have a feeling that Stacey Hunt will become a rather well known author in the future if only she can hone her writing abilities and break out of the vanity publishing ghetto. I definitely wish her well and hope that I will soon see a book by her published by one of the major publishers.
