Mary H. Herbert is one of my favourite writers in the Dragonlance saga - and this book didn't disappoint. A short while in, I was caught up in the tale and just read and read and finished it in a couple of days. The female protagonist is the same as in an earlier novel, The Clandestine Circle and I enjoyed meeting back up with Linsha and her companion owl, Varia.

In the part real, part ghost twin city of Mirage/The Missing City, Linsha struggles to overcome dragon overlords, invasion, loss of friends, ambush, attacks on her honor, prison - all in a days work of a female Solamnic knight from the Majere family.

Together with friends from both The Legion of Steel, the city's Militia and a few Solamnic knights, she fights against the far superior invading force of Brutes/Tarmak.
