Silenced by Sugar is the fifth book in Catherine Bruns' awesome Cookies & Chance Mystery series. The writing style flows smoothly in this fast-paced cozy whodunit. The storyline is well thought out with affable, well-developed characters, an interesting mystery to solve, and a perfect mix of mystery, friendship, romance, a few quirky characters, and lots of humor. There are plenty of twists and turns, red herrings, and suspects to keep the reader engaged. The villain's reveal came as a surprise to me.

Sally 'Sal' Muccio and Mike Donovan are settling into married life, and her cookie shop, Sally's Samples, located in Colwestern, New York is in its second year of operation. Sal's parents, Domenic and Maria, are always doing something to embarrass Sal and Gianna, her sister, and this time they're both in a funeral home commercial, Dominic has purchased a second coffin and placed it in his house, and announces that he's going to write a book. Sal and Josie Sullivan have been best friends since childhood, and while Josie's a paid employee, the superb baker is the shop's backbone.

After a busy holiday season, sales have slowed to a crawl, so when Donna Dooley, a popular Food Network talk show host invited them to appear on her show, Someone's in the Kitchen with Donna, because they'd won a Cookie Crusades competition for their original fortune cookie recipe, they were hopeful it would boost their profits. As luck would have it, Kelly Thompson, Donna Dooley's personal assistant and owner of a popular sugar free bakery, Naturally Delish, turns out to be Josie's former culinary school nemesis. Josie promises to hold her anger in check, but Kelly and Josie provoke each other and a food fight commences in front of a live audience. Since trouble seems to follow Sal wherever she goes, it shouldn't have come as a surprise when it's discovered that Kelly's been murdered and Josie is the prime suspect. Someone replaced the insulin in Kelly's vial with antifreeze and the only fingerprints on the vial belong to Josie. Sal is determined to prove her friend's innocence. Sal's investigation into the murder turns up lots of suspects and while Brian Jenkins, a Colwestern Police Force officer, isn't happy she's involved herself in yet another murder investigation, he praises her for her insightfulness.

In the midst of the investigation, a man shows up in Sally's Samples, announcing he's her father-in-law, Sam Donovan, who she's never met. All Sal could think about was how this would impact Mike since his dad had walked out on him and his drunk mother twenty-five years ago, leaving Mike with a traumatic childhood. Grandma Rosa, who is always mixing up the words in everyday cliché sayings, continues to give Sal sage advice.

Sally and her best friend have been asked to appear on the television show, Someone's in the Kitchen with Donna. This is a perfect opportunity to promote Sally's bakery. The host Donna Dooley's assistant is Kelly Thompson. Kelly is Josie's rival from culinary school. Tempers begin to flare between Kelly and Josie. Their excitement over being on the show abruptly ends after there is a murder. Josie becomes the prime suspect. Sally knows that she must do everything she can to locate the murdered. This newest book shows a more emotional side to Sally, with a different focus than previous books. Instead of detracting, it reflects the natural progression in real life and adds to the story. I love how the author has allowed Sally to grow over the course of the series and how she now exhibits an inner strength that wasn't apparent at the beginning. Even her best friend, Josie, notices. And that's saying a lot because Josie is quite the spitfire!

Sally's strength and determination are soon put to the test when Josie is arrested, accused of murdering her former nemesis. Karma has returned to Colwestern, New York, and Catherine Bruns is brilliant at putting it center stage! This fifth book in her Cookies & Chance Mystery series finds Sally Donovan (finally married to Mike) and Josie Sullivan (her BFF and head baker at Sally's Samples) being invited to be guests on Someone's in the Kitchen with Donna, a popular show on the Food Network. The host, Donna Dooley, has purchased the Cookie Crusade contest and hopes to revisit past winners highlighting their signature cookie recipes and plugging their businesses. What an absolute honor and she wonders it would do for the bakery's bottom line is incalculable! But, enter Josie's former culinary school nemesis. Kelly Thompson, Dooley's personal assistant and owner of her own popular 'sugar free' bakery Naturally Delish, sabotaged Josie's work at the culinary school, and now, does not miss an opportunity to insult and demean Josie at every turn. Even when Sally and Josie (promising to hold her anger in check) shows up at the studio to tape their spot, Kelly goads Josie into a violent reaction when she reveals to everyone the very personal reason Josie left the culinary school without graduating. Josie will seriously regret the ensuing 'cat fight' when Kelly ends up Karma's next victim...I love it!

Catherine Bruns has penned another well-paced mystery with more than Josie on the list of suspects that would have loved to see Kelly 'out of the kitchen' for good: On set conflicts? Professional jealousies? Secrets and lies? Karma has a lot to choose from! Bruns provided clever clues to follow, engaging descriptions and dialogue, and a realistic investigation style for Sally, although she admits multiple murders have forced her to improve her sleuthing skills. Catherine's story is the signature exciting page-turner, but it's the character driven plot lines that keep me coming back for second, third, fourth, fifth helpings. I love Sally and her quirky family, and the new challenges with which she is confronted in her newlywed life. I enjoyed the spotlight on Josie's background, too, as well as the friendship between Sally and Josie that is more like sisters. Fans, like me, will be thrilled with this new book, but newbies should not shy away even though a lot has already passed. There are references made to background and character connections, but no spoilers to interfere with going back and enjoying the other books. Start here to satisfy your sweet tooth, then go back at book one, "Tastes Like Murder." Be sure to get baked, burned, and frosted and you'll be a fan, too!
