Athena is a widow and a Domme. It's been two years since she's lost her husband and submissive to cancer. She spent two decades building a company, lifestyle and home with him. She's lost without him, and doesn't know how to get herself back.

Dale is ex SEAL, Master Chief, that's retired due to loosing a limb in combat. He was lost and finds his calling in Domme. He's so great he's called "Master Craftsman". These two find their way back from the struggles they go through, and Dale helps Athena really become who shes always been.

The problem that I had with this book is Athena. She was such a pushover, which I'm guessing is what a submissive is suppose to be like?? She's the CEO of Summer's Industries, a powerhouse of a woman, in the Private Club, she is a Domme and known as Lady Mistress. All want to be owned/subs to her, all want a chance because she's so good at it. Not once did I feel like she was this strong woman that they claim. Not once did I feel like she was this Domme that can make me beg for it. She's weak from the get go.

One night she visits Club Release and sees "MC", Dale, subbing a girl. She likes it so much she wishes he would do that to her. She leaves and is mugged outside the club at a nearby gas station. Dale saves her, he becomes her hero.

Athena was a Domme to her husband before he died of cancer a few years ago. Since his death, she has visited their club of choice but cannot bring herself to pick another sub. Not only does she feel too guilty, but no one seems to trip her trigger in the least. She has healed as much as she thinks she can from losing the love of her life. She thinks that maybe that part of her life is over, that her husband was not only her one true companion, but her one submissive as well.

"She told him that she'd be all right, that his Mistress would always love him. He would like her putting it in those terms, she knew. So his Mistress let him go, even as his wife sat at his bedside, clutching his hand, the loneliness closing around her when his breath stopped and he obeyed her."

Until she sees a certain Master one night at the club and is captured by his ability with his submissive.

Dale is a retired Navy SEAL, and considered to be one of the most proficient Doms at the club. But when he sees Athena's reaction to a scene between he and a sub one night and then gets the opportunity to play hero later when she's nearly robbed, Dale takes full advantage of his suspicions. Of course, he is correct in thinking that Athena's status as a Domme only stemmed from her submissive desires to do anything she could to please her husband.

In other words, she's always been a closet submissive.

So this is the story of Dale teaching Athena to accept her true nature and to give herself to him, her Master. And in turn, she teaches him how to allow someone else to care for him...sort of.

MY THOUGHTS:

Boy, was I not ready for this book. I feel I need to clarify my experience with BDSM books so that you will understand my stance here. I've read a few of the genre. I know my limits, and I do tend to like the lighter, more playful punishments and scenes. I can handle the lighter stuff. That being said, a friend convinced me to give Joey W. Hill a chance, and two of her books went straight to my favorites of all time shelf. Neither of these books was necessarily light BDSM...in fact, each had a couple of very cringeworthy scenes. However, the characterization and the stories themselves were ultimately *beyond beautiful and so evocative* that I actually understood the BDSM elements **more than ever before**. I understood the need to submit, the need

to let go of all choices, the trust that it takes to give yourself over completely to this other person and expect them to not only push you past your limits, but to make you crave it as well. These books, in case you want to give them a whirl, are:

Mirror of My Soul

However, this book didn't come even close to either the intensity of emotion or give me the ability to empathize with the characters. I couldn't connect with either of them. That was the first strike. I just felt like Dale was a very flat, one dimensional guy. We know a few facts about him...his Navy career, his sexual predilections, and a handful of things about his past. But we don't spend any real time with him as anything but a Master. I thought at first that I would love him, but I felt like I just kept expecting something to happen that would make me fall, and it never happened.

Same with Athena; all of the elements were there for me to click with this woman, and I just couldn't. She didn't come across as submissive to me. She came across as weak. She could pretend a good game in the corporate world, but in private, she was so unsure of herself, so timid and accepting of anything that Dale would do to her, I honestly ended up just being a bit disgusted.

A few specific things bothered me more than others.

1. When Dale won't give her a safe word, AND he takes away the ability to gesture as well, because obviously he's been with her long enough (a couple of weeks at the time) that he will be able to read her body language.

2. When he gives her a ring gag and fucks her mouth...and afterwards, scoops up the drool and semen and feeds it to her.

I stuck it out because I expected more, and I just kept getting more and more...spankings and punishments. I'd say that roughly 75% of this book was Dale punishing Athena. Like I said in an update, had this been a romance book and the 'scenes' been sex, it would have been laughable. As it was, for me, it was SO RIDICULOUSLY overdone. THIS was the reason I didn't connect with Athena or Dale. I could see them as nothing but a Dom and his sub. They stopped being real to me, and started inducing eye rolls.

While this book does not necessarily hard core BDSM, I would not categorize it as light either, mainly due to the sheer amount of 'play' going on. Not to mention, there is a huge difference in embracing your submissive side and just accepting whatever someone wants to do to you. I think there is a delicate balance there, and she missed the mark for me. I was more often either bored or horrified. And if there was romance here, it was way overshadowed by bruises and punishments.

I just lost my Joey Hill virginity and let me say... WOW, the woman knows her BDSM and she can write it freaking darn well. I would have probably never picked this up on my own, mainly because I'd never read a book by her and I don't normally go for middle aged characters. I however stumbled upon it through Irene's review and decided to buddy read it with a bunch of enthusiastic Joey fans. It's not a question of being turned off by a more mature H and h. I find the thought of a middle aged alpha pushing 50, absolutely exquisite. I'd just never had the experience of reading about one. As human beings, we tend to gravitate toward what we know and this is something I'd never come across. I normally stick with characters either considerably younger than me or around my age.

Well, I'm glad I took the chance at a total unknown! (Awesomeness ensued). Otherwise I would have missed out on a beautiful love story full of heart and a deep, intelligent introspection on what it means to love someone. This goes to great lengths to explore what that love means for our sexual identity, and how a D/s relationship fits into all of that. If you want a book that thoroughly and patiently explores the psyche of BDSM from a loving standpoint, through mentally balanced, more mature lovers who have been through so much in life, READ THIS. This is for you.

And it couldn't be more removed from the New Adult stuff freely floating around these days.

I really liked this book. I think it was incredibly well written, skilfully and carefully woven, realistic to a tee. Athena is a 46 year old high Louisiana society lady who lost her loving husband of 20 years just 3 years ago. Dale is a SEAL veteran running a junkyard/dog rescue. He lost his leg during service and now wears a prosthetic leg. He's an experienced Master... with the level of skill a sub wets her panties dreaming of. They meet at Club Release (both are members) eyes connect... and BAM, they connect in other ways. The rest is a seductive, leisurely unfolding of the relationship that ensues, deeply sexual, highly soulful.

God, I really liked Dale, even much more than Athena, not that she was unlikable. She was great, maybe at

times a bit TOO perfect, which detracted from my ability to see her as a living breathing human being at times. But that man... that man is the stuff dominance and virile strength is made of. He was described in such rich perfection I felt like I could smell and taste him, and his perceived weakness of the missing leg only added to his devastating sex appeal.

Me while reading about Dale:

So why did I only give it three stars? I really like this book, one or two scenes I even loved. I did. I think my main problem was the pacing. As poetic, rich and descriptive as Joey Hill's writing style is, Athena's inner monologues oftentimes were so longwinded, so pervasive, the pacing slowed to a glacial crawl. Also, the romanticism of her style has a tendency to cross into purple territory at times. The story simmered but never truly, completely exploded. I wouldn't call it boring, just a bit too descriptive for my liking. I'm also a sucker for hyper-intense relationships, unexpected twists and heart splitting angst, which this wasn't really about. This was more of an cerebral journey, interspersed with a few HOLY HELL THAT'S HOT sex scenes.

I'm not too crazy about tropes where one of the MC's has already loved deeply before, so that may have added to the inability to cross from liking it to truly loving it. It does make for a good read it's just not a favourite trope of mine. While I appreciate that Athena's deep love for her deceased husband Roy, was constantly... and I mean CONSTANTLY referenced to in the book, it just isn't my preferred way to get lost in an erotic fantasy. I get why it was necessary, it was THE only way to be both realistic and respectful toward the memory of her lost love. This has got to do more with my own particular tastes than Joey Hill's decisions.

As to the BDSM in this book, the last scene at the club is pretty hard-core, involving (view spoiler). If you're adverse to hard-core BDSM practices, especially in a club setting then this is not for you.

If you want something very quick-paced, this is not for you either.

If on the other hand, you don't mind taking it slower, savouring a love story like a finely aged wine, taking your time getting to know every detail of the two main characters, down to the colour and pattern of the coverlet on their bed, this will rock your world. I think it's great for someone wanting to experience a love unfolding later in a couple's life, highlighted by deep introspection of what it means to be a Dom and a sub.

As usual, Joey Hill superb writing comes through in Unrestrained. But while the writing may be exceptional, this book is far from being my favorite. I liked it and enjoyed aspects of it, there are parts also which I didn't care for as much.

What I liked...

- The older MCs. Joey is one of those authors who isn't afraid to have a 46-year old widow and 50-year old disabled veteran as main characters. That's one of the things I've always loved about her books. Which brings me to the second thing that I liked about this book.
- Dale being a disabled vet and a dom was great. It added complexity to his character. Most of the BDSM books I've read, a dom is almost always handsome, rich and physically perfect or whole. Again, kudos to JH for writing that into Dale's character.
- I also liked how Athena's relationship with her husband was written. It's obvious that they both loved each other very much and his death left a huge void in Athena's life, not just her being a Mistress but as a wife and partner.
- I also liked the parts when Athena and Dale are outside of their BDSM persona as master/sub. Their emotions and their vulnerability was more evident. It made me root for them, for their relationship. While these scenes were few and far between, there were enough of them to keep me interested in finishing this book.

That being said...

I must say that this book is a little too intense for me especially the spanking. Dale is a relentless dom. I say relentless because he never lets up. He's on dom mode all the time. I felt that he can still be a dom and still show a sensitive side but no. He's almost brutal in meting out those punishments. He doesn't ever let go of his control. Ever. His physical disability may have been a factor but come on, dude! Just relax a little. I would have loved to see him let go a little. He can be all dom in the bedroom and in the club but outside of it, the dude needs to chill.

I felt that the one thing that this book lacked, which could have changed the whole feel of the book for me was balance. I've read my fair share of extreme BDSM scenes to know that I prefer my books, be it a BDSM book or not, to show softness to balance out the harsher aspects. More romance to balance out the intensity of their BDSM relationship. But overall, this book is still a lot better than other BDSM books out there. :)

This book was about a lot of different things for me.

Although it was based around the Dominant/submissive relationship and all that entails with clubs; I got a much more than that from it.

What was so highly attractive from the very start was the fact these main characters were in their late forties.

These people had lived lives before meeting each other; they had experienced real tragedies and had to overcome them. They had responsibilities and were full formed. And they had loved; one had married and given everything to her husband in the way he had wanted it. The other had loved his career; his comrades, county and the satisfaction of being able to make things right.

We meet these two people both handling different issues; but both just as serious.

She lost her husband of 20 years to the ugliness of long term disease. In their day to day life, husband was powerful yet caring, running a multi- million dollar company with locations all over employing thousands. He was her man and she loved him. She loved him in a way that meant she would do whatever to make him feel the love. She showed through her help with fundraising and charity work for the company; doing events and affairs for their friends and then she showed him in the most loving of all ways... she became his Mistress to his need to be the sub. She took on that identity proudly, wore it like a cloak. They would be with their friends at their club and all would admire the way she handle the scenes with him. Clearly they were the perfect couple... her Dom to his sub.

But now her husband is gone and she is adrift... she has mourned his loss as best as she can... she has come out from the fog which she was lost in for over two years; she is here at the club watching from a distance. She doesn't feel the pull to be the Dom with someone new. She is here because it was a place of very happy memories with him and yet nothing is really right.

It is during this casual visit she sees Him. He is known as Master Crafter and he is doing a scene with a young wisp of a thing, Willow. He is working this like a conductor; ebb and flow... murmuring in her ear when needed, taking her to levels of bliss for her through all manipulation he see fit. She has given herself to him, the Master, willingly and has been rewarded for it.

This stirs something in Athena; recognition she cannot put her mind around. She watches; wishes it was her being handled by the Master and it is confusing. She leaves and ends up being accosted by thugs at the gas station right in view of the club. She is fighting them off as they try to take the rings her husband had given her. The fight is at the point where she is in real jeopardy and Master C steps in and handles these thugs easily. She is very disoriented and he takes care of her; she ends up at his home, sleeping in his tshirt with the overwhelming feeling of safety surrounding her.

As they both talk with one another, Athena learns Dale was a Navy Seal; he is now retired and devotes his time to training dogs in need of homes.

Dale sees who she is; he senses right away her confusion and uncertainty as he knows she is truly a sub not Dom at all. They have a connection; she is scared yet so drawn, she cannot stop her wanting to see if there is something for her to experience. Dale is open to see what she is about and how this will go. He agrees to meet with her at her home for a lunch to talk.

The lunch launches the rest of this story; and for me I liked all of the issues Joey E Hill addressed through it.

Yes, there is lots of sex with a Capital S. Yes, there is serious BDSM scenes; lots of them, varying in intensity. Yes, there is the terminology of Master and sir and all that surrounds it. This is a book by an author known for excellent writing in this genre.

But what really struck me about this book was the addressing of people with life experiences; older people trying to be open to love again. It is hard today being older and trying to meet new people.

Athena falls hard for Dale and starts to act as if she has the brain sense of a 16 yr old when it comes to her

feeling for Dale. It is so hard for people to put themselves out there and all of these NA books demonstrate that over and over again... so imagine how scary it is for an older woman to risk her safely to experience this kind of bliss.... She self sabotages numerous times... because she feels she doesn't deserve it. Eventually things happen for her to feel secure in Dale's heart and that is huge.

Yet what is even more stirring in this book is Dale.

An Alpha if ever there was one; Seal of the highest order, Major Dom; yet he has his own hurdle to deal with.... He was injured and lost the lower half of one of his legs. He wears prosthesis and has adjusted through diligent therapy and hard determination. He has learned to live with it and makes no apologies for it. But even though he is confident in who he is as a Seal; a friend; a man and Master, he still can be hit with insecurity, too. To allow Athena to help him in any way or care for him in any loving way regarding that part of him is difficult and he works hard to overcome it.

The creation of Dale and his life experiences were masterful. We received insight and a sly education about what our men and women in service experience when dealt this type of hand. I felt for Dale; I understood more of the challenges and made me take a moment to think of all the others experiencing the same type of thing.

These two are perfectly matched. They have their HEA in their own way. It is their love story with all of the ways they love each other and one of the continuing themes was just be who you are and your soul mate will be there for you as you need them to be.

About 18 months ago, I stumbled upon my very first Joey W. Hill book called Hostile Takeover. It has since become one of my favorite reads and, as of a couple of weeks ago, the most read books on my Kindle. Needless to say, Joey has become one of my favorite writers. Her books never fail to pull me out of book ruts

& they always, *always* make me feel. If I had to describe Joey's work in three words, I would have to say it's **raw, erotic and poetic**.

Having said that, when I do recommend Joey's work to someone, my recs always come with the warning: Joey is THE Queen of BDSM romance but you won't find any pink furry cuffs and gentle spanking in any of Joey's stories. More often than not, her books depict 24/7 Master/slave relationships; her BDSM scenes are often hardcore and may include public humiliation, rope bondage, gagging, flogging, anal plugs, etc. and that's just foreplay ... So, if you are only willing to give it up to your partner in a missionary position under the covers and only with the lights off, easily offended and had nightmares after reading 'Fifty Shades of Grey', Joey's stuff may not be for you. But that's OK because, as they say, there are 'plenty more of fish in the sea' or millions more books to choose from on GR, right?? Even though Unrestrained, in my opinion, was pretty tame compared to some of Joey W. Hill's other books, it still has elements of typical 'Joey BDSM' so ... readers beware!

Now onto the actual book ...

So many things I absolutely LOVED about it! Where to even begin ...

OK, I'll start in the beginning, I guess.

Leave it to Joey to deliver an awesome love story with two mature [main] characters. When I say mature, I actually mean 'mature' - both are in their late 40s which is fabulous! Both have been through the ringer in life. Both have been married. One lost a spouse to an ugly disease, another to a divorce. Neither are looking for bullshit of early stages of dating since both have been there, done that and pretty much know what they want/need.

My feelings about this story can be summed up in this quote:

"It seemed every time she was with him, he gave her a cathartic cry as well as a shattering climax."
