Against All Odds was my very first experience beta reading for an author. I was a nervous wreck, honest to God. I've followed Angie as a blogger forever, I've been friendly with her before she even created her blog. My biggest fear was hurting her feelings. I had no idea what to expect. This was her debut! This could be a train wreck. How could I be forthright about things I didn't like with sweet, sweet Angie? How could I tell her that writing just isn't her thing? But I committed myself to being honest, no matter what. Angie came to me because of my reputation as an honest, critical reviewer, and I owed her that honesty. So I jumped right in...

Well, now I'm a little pissed off at Angie McKeon. Imagine finding out that your next door neighbor baked delicious cupcakes every single day, ten feet from your house, and never offered to share them with you. Imagine finding out there was a hidden Starbucks right around the corner from your house that you never knew existed. Imagine finding out that your husband bought you a much coveted designer bag and then hid it in the back of your closet and never told you it was there. The cupcakes... the Starbucks... the bag... that is Angie McKeon. The hidden deliciousness that I just now discovered was unfairly kept from me for far too long.

I can't wrap my mind around the fact that this was a debut novel. The writing in this amazingly crafted story was so fluid, so meticulous, so well seasoned. I'm blown away by the abilities of this author to tell such an amazing story, to evoke the array of feelings that I did, indeed, feel. On her first freaking try!!!

During my read, I made some side notes, minor little details about the story that I felt were inconsistent, out of place... but I am so glad that I had the opportunity to read this book in one shot, instead of chapter by chapter as some betas do. Because by the end of the story, you see that those little details made perfect sense. They were part of a bigger picture that I just hadn't seen yet. A beautiful, painful, hopeful, heartbreaking picture that I can not stop staring at.

I live for an angsty read. I want to feel things. I want to feel everything. I want my heart to break over and over again. Sure, I love for my heart to be glued back together by the end, but I don't ever want a guarantee that it actually will. I don't know what it says about me, that I love the pain as much as the joy in a story, but it's true. I love the hurt. Probably more. And hurt, I did. I want characters to destroy each other. I want them to destroy me, as a reader. And they did. This book made me want to throw things... something so out of the norm for a reader like me. I'm so often disappointed in indie books of late. I'm so tired of the same story lines and unoriginality of authors being cranked out at warp speed. I spend so much of my time reading, noting the flaws in writing style, or inconsistencies in plot lines, that I tend to miss the feelings an author wanted me to feel. And that's not my fault... that's the author's. Suck me in and make me feel your book, or I'm going to be too bored and distracted not to miss all the areas you're lacking. Angie McKeon pulled me so deep into this story, I couldn't NOT feel. I felt things that I haven't felt while reading a book in so long. Maybe ever.

I felt the obvious heartbreak. The circumstances these characters find themselves in is absolute torture. A situation that doesn't seem like it could possibly get any worse, does. Cooper and Kylie's inability to deal with loss in a healthy way makes for the most heartbreaking journey. And I felt every awful step of it. I wasn't an outsider in this book, I was in it.

The characters in this story are perfection. Flawed, ugly, beautiful, tainted, broken perfection. Cooper. Kylie.

Grayson. Calia. Layla. It took me a while to decide if I liked them. Who I liked. If I could connect and relate to them. Any of them. Whose happy ending did I want to see? Did anyone deserve one? Even if they did, would this story allow for it? Who was the villain in this story? Was there one at all? It took me a while to juxtapose the present day characters with their flashback selves. These characters changed almost beyond recognition from who they were before tragedy broke them, to who they are now. It made for an amazing roller coaster of emotions and possibilities, wondering who these people really were, why they were behaving in such a way, and where they could possibly go from there...

I got goosebumps. Honest to God, real life, goosebumps. That never happens. I cried for three chapters straight. This is not me blowing smoke. I don't do that either. I don't cry. I have cried... in a handful of books that were just so good, it demanded it of me. But it's a rare thing for me. And it happened in this book. A lot. I was floored by this story, by these characters, but above everything else, I was floored by this author. Angie McKeon's beautiful debut story of love, loss, heartbreak, hope, redemption and forgiveness will stay with me indefinitely.

Now for those that know me, all of those things combined + angst overload is literally my worst book

nightmare come true (as in I will break things/scream like a banshee/hands fisted like claws the entire time) but still...I chose to read it and as much as I hated the book for feeding me so much angst, I don't regret it. But I would not re-read it either. Once is enough. I agree with what Katy Evans said...this is a book I won't be forgetting anytime soon.

So the story begins with a heartbreakng prologue. *dun dun dun* Through this unfortunate ordeal, both Kylie and Cooper are physically and emotionally torn apart from each other; both use this experience to lash out at one another and it leads up to one huge betrayal on Kylie's part which kickstarts their open marriage agreement: they still love each other but it's *too hard* to be together so they need space. Now the way I say it here is so stiff, but when I read this part in the book it was quite emotional and I could sort of understand where they were coming from.

“Dreams have a way of shattering you when they don’t work out. The illusion of hope is a very dangerous thing. Once you’ve lost that it’s like a black hole that sucks the very life from your soul, making you doubt your purpose.”

So they work out their arrangement, but at the same time I could tell that it wasn't what they *really* wanted...both had endured so much for each other in the past it all tipped over so they're scared and apprehensive of giving their relationship another chance. But at the same time, they can't help but *feel* attached and responsible for one another. No matter how hard they try to lose themselves in alcohol, work, other people, etc...they're still connected and the author beautifully portrayed it all.

“We share a reckless, toxic love that feeds the brokenness in me, in us. Our love is an addiction. A love that I won’t ever consider living without.”

In the midst of it all, Grayson (BFF to both Kylie and Cooper) is just *there* for Kylie and supports her through every. damn. thing. that. happens. to. her. In his eyes, there is no one more deserving of love and happiness than Kylie so it's completely understandable that he falls in love with her. While Kylie loves Grayson dearly and would even die for him, her feelings don't amount to love and definitely not the love she has for Cooper so she continuously turns him away and furiously works on mending her marriage with Cooper. At the same time, Cooper realizes how much he needs and wants his wife back, and so he too starts to work on his marriage.

I was truly touched by Kylie and Cooper's healing process. They went through a lot to end up where they are now, and I liked how the author slowly reconnected them so that they had time and enough trust to forgive and move on.

However.

In the process, they **broke** Grayson.

Truly.

Utterly.

Broke.

His.

Fucking.

Good.

Full-of-life.

HEART.

And I will *never, ever* forgive them for that.

I don't care that he's a third wheel, an outsider looking in, or just their "friend." He was more than the two of them put together and to see him fall into his rock bottom made me want to punch Kylie in the tit and cut off Cooper's balls. Still, I have to give props to the author for making me feel elated and relieved that they got closure from their past and found the courage and strength to move forward, but that is all I am willing to feel for them. Really sorry about that, but what they did to Grayson (no matter how much it was in the name of love) was unforgivable in my eyes.

This author did a number on me. I don't think I'll ever recover from the story and I find myself thinking about the book almost daily and that scares me. Hopefully by the time I finish this review the voices will die down but somehow, I highly doubt it. Just the writing alone is golden and worth all the angst and heartache I went through.

In her debut novel, Angie McKeon says she strives “to make you feel.” I can guarantee that she met her goal with me. I’m just not sure they were the feelings she was intent on achieving – at least where this reader was concerned. I had a very difficult time with this book from start to finish. I think McKeon has strong writing skills and the makings of a successful author, but these characters didn’t evoke much sympathy from me – other than for the loss of their child.

I’ve had two miscarriages myself and through the years watched as family and friends lost children tragically. Never have I ever seen any of them deal with the sorrow and pain in such a manner as shown here. Of course they grieved, endured horrible agony and withdrew for lengthy periods of time, and some sought counseling. And yes, one couple even divorced after an affair. But none ever ran helter-skelter destroying lives of their partners, friends or innocent people who cared about them with the type of bizarre behavior these characters displayed.

I felt that Cooper took the worst of the wrap – and why, I’m not sure. His loss was equal to Kylie’s. Kylie, in my opinion, expected to be nurtured, placed on a pedestal, and kept on center stage. She came off as a selfish and self-centered drama queen. And the open marriage plot sickened and disgusted me. I can’t understand how anyone would, in their wildest imagination, ever think this would have a positive or healing effect for the problems facing Kylie and Cooper. And yes, I see it as cheating. If you choose to be with someone other than your spouse, get a divorce.

And then there’s the “love” triangle between Kylie, Cooper and Gray that frankly disgusted me (and I’m not a hater in general of the love triangle trope). I’m not letting Gray off the hook for his part in this ill-fated mess either. In my opinion, he turned his back on his best friend of over twenty years without anything but selfish motives. Yes, Kylie played, teased, and tempted him but, in turn, he was a first-class enabler where she was concerned. I’m glad I don’t have to choose any of the three for a best friend – but if I did, at this point Cooper comes out on top.

I realize I am in the minority on this one – but for me personally, this one stretches the scope of realism too far to accept, excuse or overlook.

Kylie Bailey is a 24 yr. old woman living in Tampa with her husband Cooper Bailey. They work together and co-own Cooper Bailey Corp., where they run a successful insurance office. They sleep under the same roof at night, and co-exist at work and home, but haven't really connected in over 2 years.

Two years ago their whole world shattered, and they didn't know how to cope. Instead of turning to each other for comfort, their marriage fell apart. They were together since they were 16, and still loved each other, so they weren't prepared to divorce. Instead Kylie suggests an open marriage.

My feelings for Cooper were so conflicted. I wasn't his biggest fan in the beginning. The first half of the book, I didn't care much for him, didn't really know what to think. Then about half way through, I got his p.o.v. And it changed EVERYTHING. Kylie isn't the only one who has made mistakes. Cooper has too...

I've starved my wife... I've starved her of my love.

Throughout the first half of the book, I just kept yelling (in my head) at Cooper to wake up! I know he could feel Kylie's pain, see why she was doing what she was doing. Yet he did nothing. I'm so happy I could finally feel the love for Cooper. He really was a good man, but he was also blind sighted by grief and loss.

My man, and the best friend **Grayson**

“What’s that love costing you?”

?Along her path of devastation and destruction, Kylie had a friend she could count on. Someone who was always there for her. Who listened to her, loved her and didn’t judge her. That person was Gray, Cooper’s best friend. After two years of being that guy, of course some feelings are going to develop. Gray is sick of standing by and watching Cooper and Kylie self destruct. He’s sick of picking up Kylie’s pieces and watching her hurt herself over and over.

“I swore I’d never get between you and Coop. It wasn’t my place, and it’s never been my intention. When I started taking care of you, all I wanted was to support you guys. But it’s turned into a dysfunctional mess, and I can’t watch him hurt you anymore. I won’t allow it. I just want you happy, sweet cheeks. It kills me to say this, but I don’t think Cooper’s that guy anymore.”

?I swooned over Grayson. From start to finish, I loved this man. He was sensitive to Kylie’s feelings, of her relationship with Cooper. Two years is a long time to be there for someone like that. He’s an amazing man. One of the hardest things about this story was (view spoiler)

If you’re anything like me, you might wonder.... why? Why choose this ‘open marriage’, why not just divorce. It’s not as easy as you would think... in a normal situation that would be the perfect solution. For Cooper and Kylie, not so much. They need each other, they just can’t meet each others needs at the time.

We share a reckless, toxic love that feeds the brokenness in me, in us. Our love is an addiction. A love that I won’t ever consider living without.

There were many times I wasn’t sure how this couple would survive, if they could make it. Is there a way to come back from something like this intact?

With everything they have going against them, can Kylie and Cooper make it? Against All Odds, will they pull through?

I know a lot of readers are going to shy away from this one due to the angst and the subject matter and that’s really a shame. It’s a shame because this is one of the better books I’ve read this year. It’s so beautifully written, original and refreshing. I would have never guessed this was a debut novel if I hadn’t known. The writing was phenomenal. I was impressed with how unique the story line was, I can’t say I’ve ever read a book quite like this. It evoked many feelings from me. Most of them weren’t all that good, especially in the beginning, but the healing process is a beautiful thing. Just like Kylie and Cooper started to heal, I found myself healing as well.

Now the questions I KNOW everyone will ask- Was there cheating? Was there a love triangle? Not in the

traditional sense. Due to their ‘arrangement’ all the lines are blurred. Personally, I would say yes (slightly) to the love triangle (view spoiler)... the cheating, I’m going with no. To me, it was a really fucked up situation, but I wouldn’t call it cheating.

Against All Odds was a spectacular story about love, tragedy, loss, hope and the power of healing. It was an emotional ride... I was in tears for a good part of the book, but I love when a book can bring out those types of feelings in me. Even with some of their poor choices, the characters were likable and relatable. I was wowed by this story. This is a book I enjoyed from start to finish and one I would highly recommend!

“Never,” I whisper. “I could never regret being with you. I’ve always loved you. That’s never stopped. Even in the most painful moments when I wanted to hate you or when I didn’t understand you, I’ve loved you.”

“We’re a fucked up pair.”
