If I had to rate this, I'd call this a "so bad it's good" type of manga. I did have a level of enjoyment to it, but ultimately the biggest problem here is that this is a fairly superficial story. I do acknowledge that it's based off of a monthly Harlequin novel, but this just feels slightly less well developed than it could otherwise have been. It's not bad, but it just felt like it could have been better.

I think that part of why I felt that this is a shallow story is that this looked like it was part of a series or at least the beginning of one, with the inevitable book for each eligible bachelor. Things happen a little too quickly and a little too easily, without a lot of interference or true strife. The characters are fine, but underdeveloped for the most part. Michael is the most well developed of the group, but even so we never really get that good of a glimpse at him.

The artwork is fairly cute, which is probably the biggest saving grace of this book. It's not perfect, but it's

pretty much par on course for the Harlequin Romance Manga series as a whole. It's just good enough to keep it from being forgettable and has several cute scenes, but isn't so good that you'd really go out of your way to read it dozens of times.

I think the best way to describe this book is that it's very much like the format the original book was released in. This isn't meant to be a serious manga ala *KareKano*, where people revisit again and again. It's meant to be the type of manga where you read it for the wish fulfillment, then toss it aside and maybe read it again sometime in the future. That said, I've seen better from the Harlequin manga line and that's part of the reason I'm only giving it three stars. This is just a somewhat lazy rendition of a Harlequin Romance novel when you really get down to it.

The price on these are usually under five dollars, so if you really want something to waste a bit of time on then this isn't awful. I'd suggest getting it from the library, but as these are digital only I don't imagine most libraries would carry these. You might want to hold out and check out the ratings for some of the other titles, though.
