Fae Guardian is the second book in Nicolette Reed's brilliant Soulstealer Trilogy. It continues Valora's story from Fae Hunter – although the events of Mane Attraction take place in between the books, and I would highly recommend reading it before you start Fae Guardian as it does answer some questions. Like Mane Attraction, this is very definitely an adult book!

It was really nice to see Valora again. I really enjoy reading about her exploits and the situations that she manages to get herself into! It was also interesting to read about Kit's changes and her relationship with Mane from Valora's point of view. I was also really pleased to see both Dooley and Aric again, and to find out more about them. Reed did a great job at writing the tension between them; it was a really interesting mix of jealousy. I also loved the progression of their characters.

My main complaint of Fae Hunter was that I felt most of the events took place in Dell'Aria, and that hardly any of the book took place on Earth. However, in Fae Guardian Reed does a brilliant job of balancing the plot between the two worlds. I'm not sure where to begin talking about the plot of this book, except to say that it takes threads from both Fae Hunter and Mane Attraction and runs with them; weaving them into something brilliantly complicated and enthralling. I don't want to give anything away, but the end of Fae Guardian promises a really interesting third book – which I look forward to getting my hands on, as there are a lot of questions I want answered!

If you are a fan of kick-ass heroines and of either the paranormal romance or the urban fantasy genre then you should definitely check this book out. Reed has created an interesting world, and I hope we get to see more of it. Fae Guardian was a brilliant read, and I am glad that I had the opportunity to dip back into the world.

#### Review:

After reading Fae Hunter (Soulstealer Trilogy #1) and then the novella Mane Attraction (A Soulstealer Novella (Book #1.5)) (which should NOT be skipped) Fae Guardian: The Soulstealer Trilogy, Book #2 was a "must-buy" since the story was enjoyable, passionate and at times a bit tragic but the heroine Valora just keep on ticking.

This story was as enthralling and full of twists and turns as the others but it takes a bit darker turn and much to my dismay the author has once again inserted Aric back into the fray (who I personally consider a psychopath) and then to lessen my enjoyment even more added a lot of angst and even a Ménage à trois which did nothing for my enjoyment of this book, but the story is so addicting I only dropped my rating about half a star. Obviously, those things won't bother other readers so adjust as you see fit. The biggest thing was that the clear cut characters from Fae Hunter seem to have acquired a darker personality and motivations that are totally unclear, while this may add to the mystery a bit, I think it might confuse readers since the main heroine was about the only one whose personality stayed true to the first book IMHO.

I should mention that the events at the end of book 1 are not totally as they seemed :) While I gave this book 4 Stars I still consider the series about a 4.5/5 rating overall, this book while adding tons to the story also added things I could have done without but I will still be waiting eagerly for the final book.
