Though it is not complete garbage, this is the most ridiculous "book" I have ever read. I have never seen a book with even 1% of the spelling, grammatical, and sentence structure errors contained in this book. Some of the sentences are somewhat illogical, and the author tends to repeat herself. The book desperately needs an editor. Further, much more detail should have gone into this book. A chart on saponification indices of different oils would have made this book very valuable. This is the missing link that should have been included. Without this, the beginning soap maker will undoubtedly face a few small disasters, if attempting to experiment past the few recipes provided. There wasn't even a reference to another source where saponification indices could be found. There were some interesting things mentioned about the history of soap, but that was very brief. Another thing that would have made this book indispensable at least to homesteaders, would have been instructions on how to make soap the old-fashioned way with wood ash, as opposed to just mentioning that it used to be done. There are a few pretty, seemingly stock pictures of soap, but no pictures of the tools, ingredients, or process. The "About the author" section doesn't really say much about the author--it just mentions a little about how great the author is at making soap, and then goes right back into talking about how to make more soap. For the right price (I got it as a free gift), I would recommend reading it, if you are thinking of making your own soap; but be prepared to cringe often. I would suggest that the author get a friend or family member to edit, and then re-release the book.
